The original SATB version of the lush and contemplative *My Lord Has Come* has been widely recorded, and is included in Carols for Choir 5 published by Oxford University Press. In a heartfelt setting of words by Todd himself, the delicious harmonies, crunchy jazz-inspired

chords and moments of dynamic intensity give an overriding sense of awe, and plant this work firmly among the classics of modern-day sacred music.





And now for something completely different: Todd's score of "Alice's Adventures in Wonderland" is an acclaimed and eclectic mix of jazz, musical and opera.

Will Todd (1970 -)

Contemporary sacred choral music has a number of stars - Chilcott, Whitacre, Mealor - and Will Todd ranks among them. *Mass in Blue*, his most discussed and performed work, is arguably one of the more respectable additions to a generally criticized lexicon of liturgical jazz. His arrangement

of Amazing Grace was played at the BBC's Nelson Mandela service, and at a private ceremony for Barack Obama's inauguration.

Queen Elizabeth commissioned Todd for her 75th birthday, and his The Call of Wisdom, performed at her 60th Jubilee with the auditioned Diamond Choir, sparked one BBC Music Magazine critic to ask "Is Will Todd slowly morphing into the new John Rutter?"

Todd is also known for his highly acclaimed "Alice's Adventures in Wonderland" for Opera Holland Park.

He has worked with some of the UK's leading ensembles, including The Sixteen, the BBC Singers, and the BBC Concert Orchestra, and performs as a jazz pianist leading the Will Todd Ensemble. Working with community, youth and church choirs in the UK, he has written a wide selection of approachable liturgical music and has directed regular workshops internationally.
